Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails.


1 Corinthians 13:7-8

Bicentennial Tidbits


Congregationalists and Presbyterians had a common origin in Calvin's *Institutes of the Christian Religion (1559)*. Under the Plan of 1801 developed by Jonathan Edwards, the denominations were united for missionary purposes on the frontier, such as at Medina. This Plan lasted for about 25 years, during which the Presbyterians obtained some 2,000 churches in the Middle-West which had been founded by the Congregational missionaries. Our 1819 organizational "Articles" were approved by the Presbytery, apparently after three years of deliberation:

The providing Prusby hory in Africa Deliberation

Woodruff, Moderator

"It is strictly enjoined on all their missionaries to the new settlements, to endeavor, by all proper means, to promote mutual forbearance and accommodation, between those inhabitants of the new settlements who hold to Presbyterian and those who hold the Congregational form of church government." (Source: 1* article, the 1801 Plan of Union)
