### **AED & CPR TRAINING**

# COME JOIN YOUR HEARTS AND VOICES AS ONE

### And/or build your upper body strength

Did you know that singing in a choir not only gives individuals a feeling of harmony, both spiritually and musically, but also physically? A recent Swedish study has found that when you sing in a choir both breathing and heart rate variability becomes synchronized when the group is singing together. When the choir members are singing, the heartbeat for the whole group has a tendency to be in the same rhythm and can have the same effect on you as yoga breathing. Why not try it out on August 26<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am in the Chapel? That is when the adult choir begins rehearsals for the fall and Christmas season. It is also "Alive on the Square" day, but we will be done by 9:40 so we have time to get over to the service. We are not singing for this service.

In addition, if you want to work on your upper body strength, you could try out the bell choir. Ringing can give you a good workout for your arms and upper body, not to mention the spiritual and musical harmony you will enjoy in the group. The bells will begin rehearsals for the fall and Christmas season at 6:15 pm in the Sanctuary on Wednesday, September 5<sup>th</sup>. # <u>Bicentennial</u> <u>Tidbits</u> Edward Kirbye

Our 25<sup>th</sup> pastor, Rev. Edward Kirbye, served three years, from 1908 to 1911. He authored a 122 page history of the Church for its 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, which has been scanned and is now available on the website [About Us > Our History]. Sunday Bulletins during his pastorate had the welcome to visitors shown below.

Rev. Kirbye was instrumental in working with Protestant Hungarians living in Medina. He invited them to hold their services in our sanctuary on Sunday afternoons with a minister of their choosing, who would conduct the service in Hungarian. Under his leadership, additional land north of the Sanctuary was purchased. The present CE building was built on this land in the 1950's. (Source: Betty Zarney's 2015 History)

We cordially invite all strangers to our services and shall be grateful if strangers will make themselves known. This church aims to be a church for all the people. # **An Important Bicentennial Project:**

# Bringing our congregation's story up-to-date

In early preparations for our congregation's Bicentennial, Pete Metzloff uncovered—and carefully preserved-- a wealth of documents that describe in detail the first 100 years of Medina UCC Congregational. After that, however, the storyline gets a little thin here and there. (Right here, we must again say "Thank You!" to Betty Zarney for her efforts 25 years ago to bring the story up to date for that particular time in our history.)

With that as prelude, I hope we can all understand that one very important facet of our Bicentennial Celebration in 2019 will include the collection of "historical tidbits" from our present-day members. We hope to collect these remembered stories in order to add them to a keepsake book and also a narrated video presentation (think Ken Burns).

To accomplish this, the Bicentennial Committee has enlisted the first members of the "Living Stories" Team. This Team already includes about eight volunteers, but since this could easily become a large undertaking, we hope to expand our Team to include:

- 1.) Anyone who wants to help tell our congregation's story—that is, to share your memories of church life, and . . .
- 2.) Those of us who are willing to visit and interview the folks in #1 above

Now, here's the best part: **These two categories are not mutually exclusive!** You can play both sides of this project at once: 1.) to tell your story to an interviewer, and 2.) to interview and record the stories of others.

Feeling some reluctance? Never fear! Anyone who is uncertain about signing up to conduct interviews can gain confidence by taking part in a session of "basic training" in the art of interviewing. And, potential storytellers, remember that you won't be giving a speech in front of a crowd, but simply conversing with one other person who interested in what you have to say about our church.

You can get involved in one or both ways by adding your name to the sign-up sheet which can now be found in the East Room.
