

CABIN FEVER



Writing a Letter

Why write a letter? Isn't all communications to businesses, family, and friends through email, Instagram, Facebook, etc.? I'm not sure, but someone said the stores still sell stationery, envelopes and note cards. Gee, I thought those were almost as extinct as 8 track tapes!

In Scripture, of course, letter writing was the way of communicating the Good News in addition to oral tradition. Take Paul, for instance. His letters include a total of 14 main letters within the New Testament. Scholars say there are more, but I guess they ended up on the editor's cutting room floor. Clearly, Paul was the consummate letter writer. Each letter is a greeting, a gospel lesson, a note of moral support and/or admonition to early churches.

Over the years, I've written hundreds of letters. These included letters to my loving fiancée (now wife), family members, friends, acquaintances, and political leaders. I really enjoyed the process of writing even if it was just a short thank you note. It gave me pause to mull over ideas, ponder relationships, share ideas etc. But somehow, I fell out of practice. I have lots of reasons that are really excuses.

Recently, I responded to a note from a dear friend and former member of our congregation. She had written a thank you letter for my (and the team's) Gospel Galley Meditations. She said that she looked forward eagerly to reading them each week. They often strike a chord within her and give her food for thought for the upcoming week. She included an update on her children who were in my Senior High classes and youth groups, as well as news of grandchildren.

So she motivated me to write a letter in return. From the thinking over of what to say, to the actual writing (yes, it was cursive!), to dropping it in the mail, the process renewed my affection for letter writing. While I am certainly no Paul, letter writing can be a refreshing and sometimes powerful personal experience. Actually, I intend to sit down and write a few notes to people whose lives have touched mine in some significant way. I hope they are a way to be in touch and bring up thoughts of our personal bonds.

So, when was the last time you were inspired by Paul? Come on now, you can do it! Pick up a pen and just sit in a quiet space to let it all flow out. Perhaps, it will be simple prose. Perhaps, it will be a message in poetry. Regardless, I'm sure the U.S. Post Office still sells stamps.
