
COIN JARS NOW AVAILABLE

CHURCH SERMON SERIES

This fall class series will remind us of why the liturgy is the way it is and help us go deeper into our worship service. Liturgy means, "the work of the people." This series seeks to show that we are more than a church on Sunday, but we ARE the church.

Class will be held Sundays following the 10:30 service in the Fellowship Hall and Wednesdays 7:30 p.m. starting September 16th.

"August"...when capitalized, refers to the eighth month of the calendar, and, like July, honors Julius Caesar **Augustus**. "august"...uncapitalized, comes from the Latin *augere* meaning **to increase, exalt.** It can also mean *inspiring awe, adminiration, reverence; majestic, imposing; of high birth or rank; venerable, eminent.*

"August" is going to community fairs, the "dog-days" of summer with hot temps and many sweltering high-humidity nights, cicadas singing in the trees, lightning bugs flashing in the grass, and sipping ice-cold lemonade on the front porch, deck, or stoop.

"august" is how we acknowledge GOD. Psalm 68:34-35 states, "Proclaim the power of God, whose majesty is over Israel, whose power is In the skies. You are awesome, O God, in your sanctuary; the God of Israel gives power and strength to his people. Praise be to God!"

"august" is how we acknowledge JESUS when we read New Testament writings. The Gospels tell of His high ranking birth taking place in a lowly stable, His ministry continuing to be told in the book of Acts, and His admiration and reverence in the letters of encouragement and commitment that Paul writes to the early churches.

This august month of August, may we be:

Awe-inspired, United in faith, Giving and forgiving, Unified in love, Steadfast, True.

4 KEYS TO MEMBERSHIP


Our fall new member classes will be held Monday, September 17th and 24th at 7 p.m. and New Member Sunday is September 30th at whatever service our new members attend.

Abolition!!!

The Compromise of 1850 admitted California to the Union as a free state. Slavery would be permitted in the territories of Utah and New Mexico. Slave trading was prohibited in Washington DC and a tough new version of the Fugitive Slave Act created a political firestorm in the North, including Ohio and Medina.



Bicentennial Tidbits

We had our own split in 1851 over abolitionism and slavery. The splinter group was called the Free Church of Medina.

The radical minority got possession of the church and locked the majority out. There was undoubtedly indiscretion on both sides. Finally in 1851 affairs reached such a state that it was apparent that some different mode of settlement must be adopted. This led to the appointment of a joint committee with power to arrange for a settlement of property rights and separation of the two factions. After full consultation a report was brought in to the effect that the majority should pay the minority \$1,000 for their interest in the property, assume all the debts of the society, retain the name of the "First Congregational Church," and that the minority should take letters and form a new organization. This report was adopted by both parties, and the minority, consisting of about one-third of the membership, withdrew and formed "The Free Church of Medina."
