COMMUNITY HUNGER OUTREACH

On October 4, 2017 the Akron Beacon Journal printed a chart showing the percent of people in Ohio who are struggling to make ends meet. This was based on information provided by the United Way.

Medina County, with a population of 66,769 total households, had 28% of households below poverty or were struggling. Medina City, with 10,090 households, had 11% below the poverty level and 31% below the ALICE threshold.

ALICE stands for "Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed." ALICE households are the working poor.

While Medina County had one of the lowest overall percentages of households in the state living in poverty or struggling at 28%, it still means that there are people who need our help.

The donations of time, money and food stuffs from the UCC allow our church to help our neighbors who are in need.

When Bad Things Happen to Good People.....

In the late 1980's, Rabbi Harold Kushner penned the title above. Today, it seems appropriate to consider why God permits terrible things.

Rabbi Kushner's three year old son had been diagnosed with a degenerative disease that meant he would only live into his early teens. He was confronted by that most difficult of life's questions, "Why, God?".

His short series of essay-like chapters plumb the depths of what it means to be truly alive in God's realm. We are introduced to many families who have been confronted by horrific tragedy and Kushner reminds us of the story of Job.

Likewise in the early 2000's television series, "Joan of Arcadia", we journey with a teenage girl who is confronted by a series of challenging life circumstances. God appears to Joan and reminds her that she promised to do anything he wanted if he would let her brother survive a car crash that left him a paraplegic. God appears in the form of various people including small children, teenage boys, elderly ladies, transients, or passersby. Joan is asked by God to perform tasks that often appear to be trivial or contrary, but always end up positively improving a larger situation. In one particularly moving episode, Joan's friend is on the brink of death in the hospital when God, appearing as a doctor, stands by her bedside holding the dying girl's hand. Joan is outraged that God did not save her friend.

Over the last several years, our congregation has walked through many '...valleys of the shadow of death...', traumas and moments of despair. It is true as I write this meditation, several of our beloved face uncertain life challenges. So what are the questions for us? Can we like Job find our way out of the painful fog of life's tragedies? Where does this lead us? What do we do next?

The facts of life and death are neutral nature, in some ways, happenstance. God inspires people to act, to become, to love, to console, to create. God seeks self-discipline as being a part of the human family and our families. God gives us sight and insight, strength and perseverance.

Praise God for having created a world that is basically good and a life worth living. This isn't about death. It is about living.
