I read with great interest Vicki Miller's writing last week about her ancestors arriving to America via the Mayflower. I, too, have ancestors from New England and though, to my knowledge, mine did not arrive on the Mayflower, they did settle in Connecticut and lived there for many generations. It is fun to visit New England and imagine what life was really like when the Pilgrims arrived. Dan and I particularly love to vacation in Provincetown, Massachusetts.

Provincetown is where the Mayflower first landed on November 11, 1620, before moving on to Plymouth five weeks later. Land's End Inn, where we stay in Provincetown, is less than 100 yards away from this little-known landing spot. When I stand at this location, there is a simplicity that makes me feel closer to God.
