HISTORIC MARKER UNVEILING

On Founders' Day, 2018, our congregation voted on which proposed Bicentennial projects should have priority. The result, by a vast margin, was to place a historical marker in front of the church building. A few weeks later, we undertook the long application process to obtain an official State of Ohio historical marker, and to also apply for a funding grant from the Wm. Pomerov Foundation. By October, we received news that the marker was on its way, and essentially paidfor. A few weeks ago, the 150-pound bronze marker arrived. (Many thanks to Brad Root and Root Candles for their generous support in taking delivery of the marker and transporting it safely to the church.) The marker is now standing in its permanent place, but concealed (no peeking!) until today, June 9th. Upon the conclusion of this morning's 10:30 worship service, we will gather on the Liberty St. lawn for a festive ceremony of dedication (and the "ta-da" moment of unveiling), with perhaps a spot of lemonade and a nosh or two afterwards. This is a "Once-In-A-Lifetime" event (unless you have the fortitude to endure until the Tricentennial in 2119). Please plan to attend!

Bicentennial Tidbits - 1972

Jerry Baker, The Manse

Jerry Baker was our 33rd pastor, serving from 1969 until 1978. For the 150th Anniversary in 1969, 350 people attended a banquet at Buckeye High School, with a keynote address by former pastor Ormund Schulz. Rev. Baker vacated the manse shown above in 1972 (along with his wife and five children) in conjunction with a pending call for an associate pastor. He simply bought his own house with a \$6,000 down payment and a housing allowance provided by the Church. Way back in 1833, our first manse was built at the corner of East Washington and Harmony (no photo has survived). In 1907 it was sold, as it was always thought to be too far away from the Church. The "new" manse of 1907 was constructed for \$3,400, replacing some horse barns. From 1976 until 1984, the Manse functioned as rental property. Then from 1984 until 1997 it was again used as housing for various assistant pastors or other tenants, and even as a rented manse for St. Paul's. By 2000, the building was in sad disrepair.

June 9, 2019 Pentecost Sunday - Strengthen the Church Offering

Acts 2:1-21

Gathered and Scattered

What was that morning like? Jesus' friends and followers gathered in a sad, small circle as they had every day in those confusing days after they thought Jesus had finally left them for good. Outside, it was a holiday and everyone was visiting Jerusalem – true believers and serious doubters and tourists looking for some excitement and pickpockets looking for some tourists. But all the people in the world who knew about Jesus were contained in one little room. They must have felt so alone in there. The few of them inside, the celebrating throngs outside.

Then, suddenly, the Holy Spirit arrived! And with that arrival came a startling revelation. They were not alone, as they had thought. They were connected to people in the past, the present and the future. They were connected to those far away and those just down the street. They were connected to those who looked and spoke like them, and those who did not.

Those gathered in that first congregation on that first Pentecost day thought they were making a closed circle, just for them. You and your congregation feel alone sometimes, too. Maybe it seems like Jesus has departed and you don't know what is next for you. But, look! The Holy Spirit is here and now, as she was there and then.

Strengthen the Church Offering
