## **GOSPEL GALLEY**

What was happening in Jesus' day? Mark 12:41-44, and Luke 21:1-4 tells the story: Jesus is in the Temple of Jerusalem teaching. The wealthy and the poor are coming into the Temple to pay their dues. A widow quietly enters the courtyard, walks up to the alms box and drops two mites...copper coins worth less than our modern day penny. The sound of these copper coins clinking into the box does not go unnoticed. Jesus, who had been watching what was going on, stops his teaching momentarily. He turns to his Disciples and calmly and coolly says to everyone gathered, "Pay attention. This poor woman has given more than all who gave their gifts out of their wealth. Because in her poverty, she put in all she had to live on." In the Book of James, chapter 5:1-6 we hear Jesus state how the rich will have misery brought upon them for being greedy, selfish, snobbish, and self-indulgent. Verses 7-12 talk about the poor being envious and grumbling. James calls both groups "double-minded" for having divided loyalties. We are to be single-minded in our commitment to obey God. Be patient in suffering, like Job who had an immense and unyielding degree of patience and conviction, especially in the face of problems or difficulty. His absolute faith in God remained unshaken despite the numerous trials and tribulations that beset him, and being so, was blessed for persevering. Can we do no less? GOD WILL bring about blessings with compassion and mercy. ON HIS TIME... not ours. So...STOP GRUMBLING. PRAISE GOD by giving whatever you can when tithing, whenever you can of time and talents. Do it all with a clear conscious, and a humble and happy heart. This week, this month and beyond...be:

## Bicentennial Tidbits – Hunger & Outreach Programs

In 2012, Neal Sadler initiated one of our first formal hunger mission outreach programs. Called the “shopping cart brigade,” it consisted of volunteers who participated in the city’s July 4<sup>th</sup> parade to collect food for Feeding Medina County. Our involvement with this mission partner increased in 2015 when coin jars were taken home to be filled during the fall and the funds provided for Thanksgiving food distributions. Over the years, we have expanded into several other hunger related activities, including cooking meals for Cup’s Café, and a “Buy One – Give One” collection of non-food items for the Community Services Center. In 2016 we “adopted” 5 (now 14) families from the Garfield School to provide fresh food.



By 2019, we were providing snack items to the Medina Library for their after-school programs, as well as providing assistance to Garfield families with the cost of laundry.

### **Infinite Possibilities**

Listen for the still speaking voice God who declares through the prophet, "I am about to create new heavens and a new earth..."

Two families of German Lutheran immigrants heard the voice in the middle of the 1800's when they traveled to Galveston, Texas in a leaky boat that nearly sank in the Gulf of Mexico. The immigrants listened to God's voice declaring that a new creation was coming as they gathered with a few other Germans who had already settled in the area. Together, the families founded a Lutheran church which they named St. Peter's.

The church members kept listening for the still speaking God, when yellow fever decimated the community twice in the next twenty years. And then they listened again when their church building burnt down a few years after that. They heard God declare a new creation was already being imagined and it gave them hope in those difficult times.

In 1937, St. Peter's adapted again, changing its worship services from German speaking to English speaking. And then, in the 1950's, there was a new creation again when the church joined the newly formed United Church of Christ.

Recently, St. Peter's United Church of Christ changed again. The small, white, traditional congregation merged with Houston's Cathedral of Hope – a tiny satellite of the huge LGBTQ congregation Cathedral of Hope in Dallas. Cathedral of Hope-Houston's pastor is African American and openly gay. The small congregation had started off as a renter at St. Peter's, but then they approached the church asking how they could afford necessary physical plant updates. Instead, representatives of St. Peter's proposed a merger. That's the how the church became what it is today – God's new creation called St. Peter United. The congregation had once again listened to the still speaking God's declaration that a new creation was being brought to life.

In just a little under two hundred years God has made many changes at St. Peter's. They were not changes that the founders could have imagined because God's imagination is so far beyond anything our human minds can create.

Listen, God is still speaking! "I am about to create new heavens and a new earth." Pay attention to what God's creative imagination might have in store for you and your community.
