

Imagine a day living as commanded by Paul in today's passage from Roman's 12. What would it be like if his bold and brave commands were as much a part of daily living as your other chores and duties? What would your daily to-do list look like? Maybe something like this:

Hate what is evil.	Bless those who persecute you.
Shower.	Grocery store.
Hold fast to what is good.	Pick up kids.
Breakfast.	Do not claim to be wiser than you

Do not lag in zeal.	Do not repay anyone evil for evil.
Catch the train for work.	Pay bills.
Rejoice in hope.	Watch news.
Morning meeting.	Live peaceably with all.
Lunch.	

It can seem absurd or ridiculous to mix up Paul's big commands with our everyday life. But maybe it makes you wonder how would it change your day if you took Paul's list of to-dos from Romans as seriously as you take the rest of your list? How will you know unless you try it?
