I am really excited by the response to our last worship series, REWRITE. Many of you have taken the time to write emails, letters, and social media messages of what you found meaningful. Jan Linn wrote about The Times REWRITE from the Summer in the 60s, "Just listened to yesterday's sermon. I came of age in the 60s while in college and my first year in seminary. It was a turbulent time and we survived many traumas, which is why I have not lost hope today. Thanks for the memories and challenge." Thank you all for the feedback.

Our next worship series is our Stewardship series entitled, Congregational Story Project. This series will have interviews from 4 families from the congregation. Our children will present the scriptures for us in creative ways. And you will have the chance to answer the following questions:

October 4: Genesis 6:5-8, God chooses Noah	What originally led you and your family to our church?
October 11: Genesis 6:9-16, Build the Ark	What is your most cherished memory about our church?

Part of dreaming that new world into being, is hiring Karen Brocco-Kish as our visitation pastor. Karen brings so many gifts to our congregation on so many levels. Her real gift is her listening presence. She will visit and maintain our visitation list as well as head up our Circle of Caring. The Circle of Caring is our visitation team of the church visiting the church, reaching out with phone calls, craft-deliveries and sending cards. All we need to provide Karen is an office space and to cover her mileage. I am so thankful for God for sending Karen to us and putting this call on her heart.

October also marks the official start of my Doctoral project with council. The idea is to turn council from a round-robin group that reports on the past into a future-oriented leadership team. We've already done this! The Property and Grounds Team found that our bell needed a lot of work done. Finance Team needed to close out our mortgage. It was the Caring Team that came up with the idea that if we raised the needed funds, then I would have to sleep in the bell tower. We called this "The Rev. In the Rafters." Evangelism Team made up t-shirts and Stewardship set up a campaign. It was wildly successful and fun and energizing! Not just council and the church were talking about it, but the whole town! There is great power in unity and connectedness.

That's the idea. So your prayers will be appreciated as we experiment with purpose! That's our October! We have lots of fun things happening beyond this so make sure to keep reading all the great things in the Messenger and on our various social media platforms.

GOSPEL GALLEY

Rewritten, Revised, Redeemed!

Over these past weeks, we have been hearing sermons in Pastor Luke's "Rewrite" series about "Faithfulness", "Tomato", "Gifts", and most recently, "Foolishness". Separately, they do not mean much. Collectively, they have more impact.

Taking each word on its own...

FAITHFULNESS: the quality of being loyal, devoted, committed, steadfast. IE: like a beloved dog or "Horton the elephant" sitting on an egg: "He said what he meant! He meant what he said, 100%".

TOMATO: a fruit, not vegetable. Plentiful, and the least toxic variety of the poisonous Nightshade plants. A bright red color with both negative and positive connotations. Some negatives of "red" are anger, desire, lust. Some positives are passion, confidence, courage, love.

GIF: we really LIKE to get them...anytime! The best Gift is freely given...no strings attached, with Love.

FOOLISHNESS: the misuse of God-given intelligence, stupidity, wicked, impious. A lack of good sense or judgment. The *positive side…Wise, having Good Sense, Discerning, Astute, insightful.*

So...what do these negatives and positives have to do with Jesus? Everything! Please! <u>Do not take The Cross [capitalized]</u> for granted, irreverently, or <u>out of context!</u> The real negative side of the cross [uncapitalized] is a cruel, brutal, merciless form of execution that inflicted extreme pain for a lingering tortuous death, hanging in humiliating, unprotected nakedness. A visual graphic message stating PAY ATTENTION PEOPLE! Take heed. This person is an example of WHAT NOT TO DO! "Shape up or suffer the same consequences!"

So, collectively...what is a Faithful red Tomato which has been Gifted with Foolishness...to be?

Answer: <u>POSITIVE in The Cross...confident passionate, courageous.</u> <u>FAITHFULLY</u> steadfast, loyal, committed. Thankfully accepting of <u>ALL GIFTS</u> which have been, are, and will always be freely given by God. FOOLISH...with God-given Wisdom and intelligence to discern what Jesus was, and is, and always will be. Through Jesus Christ, we are rewritten, revised, redeemed.

Omnipresent. Courageous. Trustworthy. Omniscient. Beloved. Eternal. Redeemed.

Wisdom for the Way

Why ten commandments? Why not eleven or thirty-nine or a hundred? Some scholars have speculated that there were ten because, even if the devout could not take the heavy stone tablets with them, they would always have their fingers. As long as one can count all one's fingers, the thinking goes, you could remember all the commandments. But why remember them anyway, if you can just look them up? Memorizing, or learning a text by heart, is a way to take it deep within. In this case, we memorize the commandments to take their messages of radical connection with God and others into our lives.

Brian Sirchio, ordained United Church of Christ pastor and beloved church musician and composer, believes that an even better way to memorize the commandments than counting on one's fingers is to set them to music. As his song *Live the 10* demonstrates through music, the commandments aren't just words to be learned, but ways for living that are more deeply understood as they are more deeply known and practiced.

In the 20th chapter of Exodus, it's plain what God expects of us
It says 1--no other gods; 2--no graven image; 3--don't take God's name in vain;
4--honor the Sabbath; 5--honor your parents; 6--thou shalt not kill; 7--no adultery;
8--thou shalt not steal; 9--don't bear false witness; 10--thou shalt not covet...
Now check this out...now remember right off there's only one Lord,
And I didn't say two and I didn't say four and whatever you do you don't bow down
before anything you make with your hands. And when you smack your thumb hard with
a hammer someday don't get all mad and shout out God's name, 'cause God's not to
blame for your lousy aim and that's right--that's right!
And remember the Sabbath, or whatever you call it, that means pray and rest--don't be
a playaholic--and you love mom and dad even when they're not wise and don't ever kill
(does that go for flies? Hey that's a good question man.) And when you marry someday
don't you be a cheat, and don't you ever steal, and don't lie through your teeth, and
don't want the things that your friend's got so bad you'd take it if you could...
