

GOT CRAYONS?

All those broken-down colored crayons can result in being gathered, melted, and turned into new crayons of many colors. This is the mission of The Crayon Initiative started by Bryan Ware several years ago. After consulting with an occupational therapist, he created large three-sided, not round, paper free crayons so that hospital kids can easily grip them, and they cannot roll off hospital trays.

Recycled crayons are distributed free to children's hospitals in all 50 states to brighten the lives of young patients during their stay. This is a multi-faceted mission project to save millions of pounds of used crayons from landfills AND to bring smiles to hospitalized children.

The Mission Team is placing colorful boxes by the church entrance and at our Hobby Horse location. After collecting these boxes, the donated crayons will be sorted by color and shipped to The Crayon Initiative in California. Because of the pandemic, further expansion of this project is limited for now but hopefully could involve more schools, churches and anywhere crayons are distributed. AI ROOT MIDDLE SCHOOL DONATIONS

We have an amazing opportunity to expand the help we give to students in the Medina City Schools by joining with a group of parents and other community organizations to provide breakfast items to a small group of in-need students at Brookdale Park. The food donations will be available for students to pick up daily as they walk to their bus stop. The food items should be durable and non-perishable and suggestions include: 6-packs of boxed apple juice and orange juice, packs of fruit cups, large boxes of pop tarts, granola bars, fruit breakfast bars like Nutrigrain, boxes of yogurt pouches, and applesauce pouches. Our first delivery is this coming Friday the 14th so the Mission Team will be providing a majority of the donations for this week but if you are able, any donation you can deliver to the church by Thursday afternoon, May 13th, would be great. TUESDAY EVENING BIBLE STUDY



STRENGTHEN THE CHURCH OFFERING - MAY 23RD

Paul addressed two very specific ways to care:

- (a) Care by encouraging one another. Hurting and dying churches need encouragement. They need folks who will come along side and help. I'll never forget the 1992 Olympics in Barcelona, Spain. During the 400-meter race, a runner named Derek Redmund tore his right hamstring. He didn't want to quit and began hopping along toward the finish line on one leg. Suddenly, a man jumped over the wall separating the stands and ran onto the track. It was Derek's father, Jim, who came alongside his son and helped him across the finish line. We need to care enough to encourage.
- (b) Care by building each other up. Unhealthy churches are made sick by discouragers, always telling what can't be done or shouldn't be done. Like Nehemiah's discouragers, there are always those who will criticize from the sidelines. A healthy church is marked by those who care for one another more than criticize one another. Encourage one another. Build up one another.

The funds raised support leadership development, new churches, youth ministry, and innovation in existing congregations. By your generosity to this offering, you build up the Body of Christ.

Friends Together

Church coffee hour is as important a weekly ritual as church worship. This project is a way for your congregation to join hands with communities in the developing world. As Christians we can address a consumer dilemma by buying coffee and other commodities that are fairly traded. Through the project, small farmers and their families gain more control over their lives, earn a fairer share of income, have access to credit and technical support, and gain a trading partner they can trust. Members of your congregation can learn about consumption habits that support small scale farmers and workers throughout the world and encourage careful stewardship of God's creation. At fellowship hour, you will be taking action in a spirit of love.

Through the UCC Fair Trade Project, you get access to Organic, fairly-traded products at discounted wholesale case prices, ensuring that more of the money you spend on coffee and other products reaches the hardworking farmers who actually grow them." *(https://equalexchange.coop/ucc)
