





REOPENING UPDATE!

At its May 27, 2021 meeting, Council approved the Reopening Team's recommendation to make the wearing of masks at worship services optional for those that are fully vaccinated. This change is effective Sunday, June 6, 2021. VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL NEEDS YOU!

We are thrilled that we will be able to offer Vacation Bible School in person this year. There will be some differences to keep everyone as safe as possible, but we are excited to be able to have the children in the building. This year VBS will be offered for 2 weeks in June. The first week will be June 7-10 and the second week will be June 21-24, with the exact same curriculum at each. So you can choose which week you would like to have your children attend. Our theme this year is "Discovery on Adventure Island" and it will be tons of fun! As always, many hands make light work. We are in need of people to help make sure it is a success. GOT CRAYONS?

All those broken-down colored crayons can result in being gathered, melted, and turned into new crayons of many colors. This is the mission of The Crayon Initiative started by Bryan Ware several years ago. After consulting with an occupational therapist, he created large three-sided, not round, paper free crayons so that hospital kids can easily grip them, and they cannot roll off hospital trays.

Recycled crayons are distributed free to children's hospitals in all 50 states to brighten the lives of young patients during their stay. This is a multi-faceted mission project to save millions of pounds of used crayons from landfills AND to bring smiles to hospitalized children.

The Mission Team is placing colorful boxes by the church entrance and at our Hobby Horse location. After collecting these boxes, the donated crayons will be sorted by color and shipped to The Crayon Initiative in California. Because of the pandemic, further expansion of this project is limited for now but hopefully could involve more schools, churches and anywhere crayons are distributed. 
We'll explore the Beatitude concepts through popular movies. We'll even gather and watch a few at our pergola (or Fellowship Hall if the weather is bad) at 8 p.m. See below for specific dates.

As the late theologian Rachel Held Evans wrote in her book "Inspired: Slaying Giants, Walking on Water, and Loving the Bible Again",

"The kingdom, Jesus taught, is right here--present yet hidden, immanent yet transcendent. It is at hand-among us and beyond us, now and not-yet. The kingdom of heaven, he said, belongs to the poor, the meek, the peacemakers, the merciful, and those who hunger and thirst for God. It advances not through power and might, but through missions of mercy, kindness, and humility. In this kingdom, many who are last will be first and many who are first will be last. The rich don't usually get it, Jesus said, but children always do. This is a kingdom whose savior arrives not on a warhorse, but a donkey, not through triumph and conquest, but through death and resurrection. This kingdom is the only kingdom that will last."

Mark 3:20-35

God's Will

Today's scripture tells a story from early in Jesus's ministry. Jesus is teaching a group of disciples in a crowded house when his family arrives to cart him away, afraid that he has lost his wits. Jesus speaks against his mother and his brothers then, saying that those who follow the will of God are the ones who are his true family.

In this story, we see Jesus bravely following his inner knowing of God's will for him, instead of the voices that have long told him who and what he is. In his new community of friends and disciples, he knows that he is truly following God's will.

Have you ever had an experience like this? How has your inner knowing of God's will made itself known to you in a community that knows and believes in you? How did you respond?

Learning to hear, trust, and follow the way God's will makes itself known in your life is called discernment. That is why, in the twenty-first century, we in the United Church of Christ call those who are finding their way toward a career in ordained ministry "members in discernment."

Discernment about ministry comes from both the nudge of the inner voice, and the affirmation and challenge of a community. According to the Manual on Ministry, the church "Ordained Ministers belong to both God and the people. They are nurtured and sustained by both; they are responsible to both.... Ordained ministry is ministry of the Church entrusted to individuals; it is not the ministry of individuals acting independently."*

Is the call of God's will in your life an affirmation of what you've always been told about yourself, or is it an opportunity to listen to new voices in a community you've found for yourself later in life? Either way, if you believe you may be called to ordained ministry, ask your pastor to connect you with a representative from your conference or association.
