NEW SERMON SERIES!

We've made beautiful art together. We've heard from our association minister for Faith in Action, the Rev. Michael Howard. We marked 9/11 and recommitted to the ways of the Prince of Peace. We've hired Minister Meghan Malone as our associate pastor of Youth and Mission! We are beautiful together!

Sometimes, however... community is a struggle. We get it wrong, and we are wounded by others just as we wound them. I think of the line, "Hell is other people" coined by existentialist philosopher Jean-Paul Sartre in his 1944 play, "No Exit." In the play, three people are trapped in Hell, which is a single, small room. The confinement of the characters extends beyond their physical holding room: they are trapped by the judgments of their cellmates causing one of the characters to say, "Hell is other people." The characters are unable to escape the watchful gaze of the other two.

Community can be hard. We struggle to make sense of other people and their judgment of us. We struggle with mental health. We struggle with our apathy and complicity in unjust systems. Yet even though we often get it wrong, the kin-dom of God is still within our midst. Even in the single room, and despite Sartre's best effort: love still breaks out in hell. While confessing their sins, the three people fall in love with one another as they discover compassion for one another. So, while hell is other people... so is heaven. Come join us in our communion of sinners and find heaven among us even now.

Psalm 137

Free to Grieve

The psalm today begins with weeping, as God's people wonder how to sing God's song

And so we hung up our harps,
there upon the willows.
For there our captors asked us for songs,
and our tormentors asked for mirth,
saying, "Sing us one of the songs of Zion!"
How could we sing God's song in a foreign land?

In 1933, in a pause between the last century's world wars, the first World Communion Sunday was celebrated as a way to celebrate the interconnectedness of all Christians in all times and in all places. Today, 99 years later, the need for unity in our diversity is as great, or maybe greater, than it was in those fragile interwar years.

This mid-and-post-pandemic world in which we find ourselves is indeed a strange land, and we might be asking ourselves how we can sing God's songs of justice, love and unity? Hope can be found in *Gifts in Open Hands: More Worship Ideas for the Global Community* by Maren Tirabassi and Kathy Wonson Eddy. This book shares multicultural liturgies, prayers, affirmations, blessings, and poetry by people from the global community. Images for reproduction in church bulletins are included, and a new feature is the arrangement of translations so that liturgies in other languages are available to English-speaking as well as bilingual worship planners. Today many UCC congregations receive the Neighbors in Need (NIN) offering. This special mission offering of the United Church of Christ supports ministries of justice and compassion in the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to provide funding grants to UCC churches and organizations leading justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects in their communities.
