





FROM THE PASTOR

Our staff took a retreat in August and we're about to retreat in Advent. We gathered to pray and plan where we would need to go this year. My friend, the Rev. Joanna D'Agostino from Lakewood Congregational gave a sermon on Jeremiah 17:7-8, "Like a tree planted by water." She stated how it's good to be rooted. Rooted in the past, in tradition, in history. With 203 years behind us, I would say we're very rooted here on the Square in our town and region.

Yet it's not good enough to just be rooted. Jesus said you judge a tree by its fruit in Matt. 7:15. We have to generate something. 'Rooted and generative' is the phrase we wanted to work on.

Three areas we wanted to focus on is to generate a growth budget. Generate good design. Generate a good team with Jenny and Meghan joining us. Another way we thought about this was to make it work (budget), make it beautiful (design), and make it together (team).

I feel our team has really come together quickly and in a short amount of time. Jenny is bringing us more sound and energy in our music than I've ever heard anywhere. Meghan is bringing her gift for writing, design, and a heart for mission in everything she does.

Our design has been shown in our Beautiful Together paintings we made at Alive on the Square. We made Beautiful Together stickers. Ryan Collins, our seminary intern, has signed us up for Canva, an online design program where the staff can collaborate on designs like never before. Meghan, Nicole, and Stacie have been hard at work in rooms 7, 8, 9/10 making a "youth corridor." They are clearing out, cleaning up, and adding a fresh coat of paint to things.

Which brings me to budget. A few folks wondered if the misprint in the letter was the \$50 a week pledge. No, that's just a suggestion the stewardship team came up with. They saw that our average income in Medina is around \$85k. The national average of church giving is around 3% which would be a \$2,550 yearly pledge or around \$50 a week. This is just a suggestion based on the data we have. We won't check your W2 or any draconian thing. Everything we do here is invitational. If your household is making around the average income, then there's your bar. If you're pledging more than this, thank you for your generosity! If you're on a fixed income or make (like I do) less than the average, then whatever you pledge is the right and generous amount.

We have come out of the pandemic strong. Strong enough to hire an associate with a specific purpose. Strong enough to hire a musical force which has reinvigorated our music program. Strong enough to keep welcoming, loving, and serving for another 200 years. With our people, in this place, I see great possibility. Let's go seize it!

NEWS FROM THE ENDOWMENT FUND

Every fall since 1995, the Medina UCC Endowment Fund Committee meets to discuss the results of the Fund's activity during the past year. The Endowment Fund's purpose is to provide funding for the future and funding for special projects and efforts of the church that are not covered by the Operating Budget. Past financial allocations supported: Mission trips to Costa Rica, the portable sound system for the Gathering Team, new furniture for the Welcome Area and the Bicentennial Debt Reduction, plus much more. A complete listing is available in the Church Office.

The year 2022 was a different year for the Endowment Fund. There were stock market losses that resulted in a lack of earnings to support the projects that might have been financed by the Endowment Fund for the operating year 2023. Being good stewards of the Fund's assets, the Committee decided that there will be no Endowment Fund allocations dispersed for 2023.

The church's finances are strong and stable. If any of the teams are planning to apply for an Endowment Fund allocation, please bring those ideas and needs to the attention of the Endowment Fund Committee whose members are Ellen Hunter, Jan Coleman, Kent Daugherty, Virginia Hall and Earle Olson. Other resources within the church family are available to support worthy requests. Our Financial Director, Jeff Miller, is always open to discussion of projects that will further the Mission of the church.

THE AMANDA FUND

Your Mission Team distributes monies from this fund to families with a child in medical crisis. Its funds are replenished through your generous donations. It was started by a family who lost their young daughter many years ago due to a devastating illness. A couple Sundays ago, we were privileged to welcome Jake Wuersig and his family to the 10:30 service. The Wuersig family received the Amanda Fund after Jake sustained life-threatening injuries resulting from a fall during a hike. He was in a coma and hospitalized for several months but is making a recovery that is nothing short of miraculous - praise the Lord! They are grateful for the loving and caring support of our congregation. Please continue to keep the Wuersig's in your prayers.

On this Stewardship Sunday, we look ahead with hope and make promises for how we as individuals will contribute to the health of the whole of the body of Christ in the year to come.

Our theme this year, From Bread and Cup to Faith and Giving, is a reminder that we give out of the goodness and abundance that we have received from a loving God. Of course, we don't just need this message and reminder at Stewardship time. At all times of year, through scripture, study, prayer and connection with our community and the wider world, we can be recalled back to the God whose love for us overflows. If you would like more resources to encourage your generous response to a gracious God, check out the books and brochures available at uccresources.com.

Everyone in the church would appreciate a copy of the brochure, "What Scripture Says About Giving," a quick and thoughtful guide to how and why to give to the work of the church.

Inspiring Generosity: A Stewardship Resource for the Local Church is a comprehensive guide to year-round stewardship. This 118-page manual is available in either book form or PDF download and features 4 fundraising methods for the local church, including "Consecrating Stewards," as well as chapters on the theological background on the motivation for giving and understanding mission.

The Gifting God: Change the Way You Look at Giving is a small group study that invites you and your small group into an exploration of what scripture has to say about giving, over the course of several weeks or sessions.

For Such a Time As This: A Bible Study for Stewardship in Challenging Times is a guide that helps readers recall the story of Esther and to ponder anew how this story might inform generous giving here and now.
