We seek your wisdom in this worship Holy One.



This sermon was inspired by that week of sabbath rest and vacation.



PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Church,

I hope your summer is going well. You're getting outside and enjoying the pleasant weather. Nothing like summer in Ohio. Or wherever this finds you, I hope you're doing well.

It has been a while since I have updated you this way. I wanted to go back to our Annual Meeting and Report from May 21st. My 3 areas of focus for the next year are as follows along with some updates:

Help Us Become a WISE Congregation: WISE is a UCC designation that would mark us as being Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged in the work for Mental Health. Our Heavily Burdened Worship series in January 2023 brought in various experts in the community to help jump start this important work. Ann Nagy has organized an adult support group and is leading the WISE Team to draft a statement. I will continue to work with them. Once we started this work, Alicia Davies became inspired and started a parents' support group. This confirms that the Holy Spirit is indeed working with us on this path.

Update: I hope you're taking care of your mental health. If you would like to attend a WISE Support group, please check the church calendar or call the office for the next meeting.

Help us Become an A2A Church: A2A is another UCC designation that stands for Accessible to All. This team has completed an audit of our physical plant and ways it can become more accessible. This team is currently comprised of Hannah Magrum, the Rev. Pam Branscome, Jen Cockrell, Kate Lindon, and Patrick Acurio. I'm excited to work this team as more accessibility is good for all people.

Update: We are currently in the worship series Human Kind: Be Both. A series focusing on A2A through the book of Genesis.

Take a Sabbatical: I will be going into my seventh year. It's time for a sabbatical. It is in my contract, and it is a tradition of this congregation to be generous with time away from the daily duties of ministry. With the permission of council and the support of the congregation at our January meeting, I have applied for a Lily Clergy Renewal Grant with the help of Todd Bauer. If I get this grant, my family and I will travel to Scotland and Ireland for three weeks in June 2024 to explore Celtic Christianity as the beginning of my three-month leave. There will be some surprises for you as well! I hope and pray we get the grant. It'll be a grand adventure. If not, then Plan B is to spend June-August of 2024 at Atwood Lake and traveling around this great country of ours.

Update: Rest is restorative. We are human beings not human doings. I hope you are observing the Sabbath. It's so important, it's in the Ten Commandments. I hope you have an epic vacation line up. I'm available for coffee and to review your vacation slideshow. I look forward to that invite. We'll hear if we got the Lily grant in August.

Genesis 18:1-15, (21:1-7)

Sarah Laughed

It is not an official church holiday, but many churches today will celebrate Father's Day. In today's scripture story, Sarah is surprised into laughter to find out that she will be a parent. On this Father's Day, recognizing that family is sometimes a source of pain and rejection as well as a haven of joy and acceptance, we give thanks for the many kinds of families that God has blessed. As you say each line of this prayer, silently or aloud, give yourself plenty of time for reflection.

How are these thanksgivings true for you?

How have they or have they not been realized?

What kind of family has God called you into? Consider this question as broadly as possible.

Dear God,

We thank you for our birth family, the family we are linked to by blood. Some of us are very close to our birth family. Perhaps this family is always on our hearts, or even sitting together this very day in this very place. Some of us are far, far away from our birth family, separated by distance or misunderstanding or time or even violence. Whatever our proximity, today we remember that it is our blood family that brought us forth, and we give thanks that we are here.

We thank you for our faith family, for the generations that stretch back further than we can see, even when we stand on tiptoe, peering into the past. We thank you especially for our parents Abraham and Sarah. We thank you that their curiosity, their faith in You, their willingness to follow Your call and their capacity for joy in moments of surprise.

We thank you for the families we have chosen. Those families we have made through law and covenant, families of lovers and friends, families of children and companions. And at the same time, we thank you for the families who have chosen us, drawn us into circles of sweet understanding and easy companionship, taught us to love and to live.

We give thanks for all the families that bring us to laughter, and all the families that we have called home.
