



SYNOD FOLLOW UP:

For Eve's kindergarten spring break, we went to The Childrens Museum of Indianapolis. We fell in love with Indy and just loved our time there.

Now Eve is heading to high school. Sam is heading to middle school. It has gone so fast. Yet I am so thankful for this family tradition of taking off to spring break to somewhere we've never been before. We have rarely returned to these places. So when our UCC National Synod was held in Indy, we knew we had to go.

We loved catching up with our former choir director, Jim Kiser, who sends his regards. He has joined a UCC church and is playing board games most nights. He's doing great and it was wonderful to stay with him.

We visited some old favorites from our trip way back when. We were able to recreate some photos. It was a holy time. A reminder of the passage of years, the growth of children into thriving young adults. Memories gone by and the present to savor and a bright future to hope for.

I came face-to-face with a core memory from my own childhood. We spent almost 6 hours at the <u>The Children's Museum of Indianapolis</u>. Half of that time was in the "Power of Children" exhibit. We learned about Ruby Bridges, Anne Frank, Malala Yousafzai, and Ryan White.

Ryan White is foundational for me. His book was one of the first chapter books I ever finished. It put me on track to be a life-long reader and maybe what started me down the path of being an ally to LGBTQ+ folks and folks with chronic illnesses. The Children's Museum has Ryan White's room recreated and tells his story of how he got AIDS from his drugs to treat his hemophilia. While we were there, we met Ryan White's mom, Jeanne, and sister, Andrea. The Elton John Foundation flies them in 4x/year to speak at the museum to visitors, we didn't even know it was that day! We sat in his recreated bedroom (all his original stuff) for their talk. We were overwhelmed with emotion.

The whole exhibit kept asking "What can you do?" The Whites moved to a new city because of the bullying... a teen saw they were going to move there & got the new school to start educating everyone about AIDS beforehand. Jeanne said how welcoming everyone was in the whole city, with kids and moms stopping by on the first day to introduce themselves. Small acts of kindness. Of being a kind human. Of educating yourself and being a good neighbor.

Oh yeah, and Synod was great and God was present in that gathering, but God shows up in Children's Museums. And was with us in our childhood. And in our growing up and aging and is still with us. For the God that was there to hear our borning cry is still by our side and still speaking, still teaching, still on the move for wholeness and peace.

I see my whole purpose of going to church is learning how to be a better, kinder, more Christ-like human. I can't say that I wouldn't have been a bully to Ryan growing up. Because of his story, I know not to be now. His life has impacted mine and because of him, I hope my children are much more kinder and willing to listen and not stigmatize those whom they don't initially understand. I think they are like this a little from the parenting and wisdom that living has given Kate and me. They are also kinder and better humans because of you, church. Because of your parenting, wisdom, and stories.

Keep being kind. Keep speaking. Keep showing up for each other. You are impacting generations.

Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23

A House Divided

In their very conservative town of Colorado Springs, CO, Vista Grande UCC has long been visible as an LGBTQ+ ally, using their sign and flagpole "to proclaim that Black Lives Matter, immigrants deserve justice and queer people are uniquely made in the image of an expansively loving God."*

Rev. Mallory Everhart, Vista Grande's pastor, believes that the church's visible commitment to providing safe haven for all on the margins helped the wider community and city to trust the congregation in the wake of last November's tragic shooting at Club Q on the eve of Trans Day of Remembrance. The shooter killed 5 people and injured 22, but Rev. Everhart adds that he "traumatized an entire community."

Everhart reflects, "On Nov. 20 and beyond, we were true to our reputation and rose up to hold space and provide care to a stunned and terrified community. In their book, *Emergent Strategy*, activist adrienne maree brown writes that community organizing 'moves at the speed of trust.' If I have any advice about crisis response, it's this: make connections and build trust now. No matter your good intentions, you will not be a community partner in times of crisis if you don't."*

In today's reading, Jesus tells the parable of the sower, warning that not all seed that is planted falls on fertile ground. He is speaking as loudly to the church of the 21st century America as he did to his little community in 1st century Palestine. In a world with growing visible division and terror, your church community has the opportunity to sow seeds now that will grow and flourish or will wither and fall away when a crisis arrives. Today is the right day to ask where the seeds you are planting are growing in your congregation, in your community, and in all the world.
