





OPEN AND AFFIRMING NOTES

Each member of the ONA team has his or her reasons for wanting our church to be Open and Affirming and reasons that we are passionate in our commitment. Here's Brad Rice's reflection.

I have 29 first cousins on my mom's side alone. Add to that 5 on my dad's side and I come from a large family. Many of my cousins are not close and I still am being introduced at certain family events. My mom had two sisters with kids living in Lodi and we were all like siblings. One cousin, Tom, was gay. I was the cousin who had found God. I had a spiritual experience at the age of 19 and it was known that I was becoming "evangelical."

When my gay cousin got married, he invited both my parents and my sister to his celebration, but I was not invited. Apparently, being a Christian meant I was not in support of a gay marriage. Quite honestly, I hadn't thought very hard about it. At one point I suggested to him that I wasn't necessarily opposed but thought the word marriage wasn't the correct word to be used as marriage should be reserved for religious people. Perhaps "union" or something would be a better word. He challenged me on that, and it did in fact cause me to think harder about my position. But too late, I missed out on his important life event. I later became close with him and his partner. They had a beautiful marriage up until his partner died of cancer last year.

I was on a church board where a board member suggested the church draft a constitutional amendment banning gays from membership. They wanted to say, "all were welcome," just not welcome to become members. I started to think about my gay cousin and whether he would feel welcome. I decided he would not and started challenging their position to no avail. I eventually realized I had to find another church. "All are welcome" is a bold statement as was Jesus' commandment to love one another. I'm excited UCC Medina is working on a statement of Open and Affirming and if the congregation supports it, we are not going to "miss out" on celebrating the lives of so many and will truly welcome all.

Psalm 19

"Beautiful Law"

Today in the United Church of Christ, we celebrate both Amistad Sunday and the first day of UCC Women's Week. As we honor the heroes of the Amistad, we remember the captured people of African descent who spoke up and fought for freedom for themselves and those who would follow. During UCC Women's Week, we give thanks for the women who, long before most congregations would ordain women into ministry, offered lifetimes of service, wisdom, justice work and leadership to local congregations and the wider church.

The Oxford Dictionary defines intersectionality as the interconnected nature of social categorizations such as race, class, and gender as they apply to a given individual or group, regarded as creating overlapping and interdependent systems of discrimination or disadvantage.

On this day, a day to celebrate and honor the accomplishments of women and people of African descent, take a moment to celebrate the 2023 election of Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson as the first woman woman of African descent to be elected to the UCC's highest office, the office of General Minister and President.

"Rev. Thompson is the third woman nominated for the post, after the Revs. Yvonne Delk (in 1989) and Barbara Brown Zikmund (in 1999), but the first to be elected. A Jamaican immigrant, Thompson is the third person of African descent to serve as leader of the denomination.

'Today, United Church of Christ, we created a first together," she said after the vote. "It won't be the last first.""*

Jesus calls us to explore intersectionality, those boundary places where social categories like race, class and gender meet and merge. Rev. Dr. Thompson has bumped into those places all of her life. Now, her leadership will provide new ways for the United Church of Christ to understand our place in the intersections of intersectionality.
