

United Church of Christ, Congregational Medina Minutes from the 206th Annual Team Meeting January 26, 2025

Call to Order: Moderator Scott Ockunzzi called the meeting to order at 11:20 am with 126 members in attendance. Therefore, a quorum was established. The Rev. Dr. Luke Lindon offered a prayer of invocation.

Minutes from May 19th, 2024: Scott asked for a motion to approve the minutes from the May 19th Annual Team Meeting. Colleen Rice so moved and Beth Hari seconded the motion. No discussion was shared regarding the minutes and the motion passed.

Report of the Church Clerk: Carl Skorepa shared a quick summary of the report noting that on page seven the names of 46 inactive members were removed from our membership rolls. He shared that four or five years ago we went through a similar process of updating inactive members for removal. Scott asked for a motion to accept the report as printed on pages six and seven. Alice Metzloff so moved and Mary Ann Blosser seconded the motion. No discussion was shared regarding the report and the motion passed.

Report of the Church Treasurer and Narrative Budget for 2025: Pete Metzloff explained various aspects of our finances and explained his narrative budget insights. With regards to the listing of the individual salaries that were printed in previous years, Pete share that Ohio law prohibits these personal salaries be printed. He shared that salaried staff will receive a 5% increase this coming year (i.e. 2025) compared to an increase of 3% in 2024. Scott asked for motion to approve the Report of the Treasurer on pages eight and nine. Dan Daubner so moved and Katy Medley seconded the motion. During the discussion, Kate Lindon asked about the pledge drive and Pete shared that a follow up will be instituted for those members who "may have forgotten to use the forms that were hanging on the refrigerator." Motion passed.

Pete shared we will be operating with a deficit budget for 2025. However, our staff and various teams are very resourceful and over many years we have avoided actual deficits. The negative \$17,748.00 deficit budget could be covered by our "Reserved Funds." When asked by Julie Gilliland about him not taking any salary for his position, Pete responded that he is enjoying this unique experience and will continue. The issue of Capital Improvement Funds was raised. Pete shared we have \$78,000.00 in this fund. However, a soon to be renovation of kitchen equipment will proceed with funds from Endowment and recent memorial gifts earmarked for the kitchen. Pete stated that Luke recently addressed this issue and that the Property and Grounds Team will begin creating a Capital Improvement Finance Campaign in the near future. Scott asked for a motion to accept the Narrative Budget for 2025 as printed on pages 12-27. Brad Rice so moved and Nick North seconded the motion. During the discussion part of this motion, John Kavouras questioned the date of "2023" in the title of Financial Overview of Flows on page 10. Pete acknowledge the typo and will change it to "2024." The motion passed.

Proposed WISE Draft Covenant: The Welcoming Inclusive Supportive Engaged (i.e. WISE) committee placed a two page (pages 29 and 30) report in the handout that outlined their work since August of 2022. WISE focuses on activities for learning and understanding mental health needs in our community. Additionally, the report indicates yet to be completed goals for WISE and a proposed covenant. Scott asked for a motion from the congregation to approve the covenant printed on page 30. Ann Nagy so moved and Melanie Kasten-Krause seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Other Business:

Updating Various By-Laws in our Constitution: Scott shared that various teams adjusted and updated their by-laws and additionally clarified their missions and ministry focus. Over the past year, a small team of dedicated staff and team members have reviewed our Constitution and Bylaws to update them to more closely reflect how the Church currently operates. The updated Constitution and Bylaws are many, many pages long, and in the interest of being good stewards of this Earth that God has blessed us with, we've printed several copies of the updated documents for review in the East Room, rather than printing them for every copy of the Annual Budget Report. Scott asked for a motion to accept the revised by-laws. Matt Yates so moved and Alice Metzloff seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Safety Team: Ken Zuehlke, head of the Safety Team, shared that team was inspired and conceived by a prompting from Pastor Luke. Ken shared the team is working on security issues, an evacuation process, and active shooter preparations. The safety team is working in conjunction with the Property and Grounds Team for security upgrades. On Saturday, May 3rd, a training session will be held focusing on active shooter scenarios.

Closing Comments and Adjournment: Scott asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting and for Pastor Luke to say a closing prayer. Leon Coard so moved and Sharon Poole seconded the motion. Motion passed and Luke shared a prayer including the blessing of the Chili Cook-off. Cathy Fafrak played *God Be With You* on the organ as the congregation held hands and sang.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SENIOR PASTOR 2024-25

My three goals from last year were:

Help Us Become a WISE Congregation: Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged (WISE) is a UCC denominational designation around areas of mental health.

-We voted on this at our January 2025 annual meeting. Thank you, church!

Help Us Become an A2A Congregation: Accessible to All (A2A) is a UCC denominational designation around areas of accessibility.

-We have taken the survey and P&G is working on some of the goals we set forth in this work.

Take a Sabbatical: Get a grant for Scotland and Ireland or travel the US.

-A sabbatical happened but the grant didn't. So, we adjusted and had a great time on the Pacific Coast Highway.

Sabbatical was a gift. Thank you. The period of rest ran from Memorial Day to Labor Day 2024 and helped wring things out for me. It was restorative. We reconnected as a family—and got a dog! Pastor Meghan did an amazing job in my absence, and I'm so thankful for her ministry.

While I was on sabbatical, season two of our podcast *REV'D UP! With Meghan and Luke* came out on Spotify. We covered atonement theories, extra-canonical texts, and some short stories. We picked back up in the fall with a visit from Colby Martin. Colby is a wonderful author and speaker who talked about *The Shift* at the end of September. I met Colby at Wild Goose; special thanks to the Endowment for making that happen. They have also funded two more speakers: Dr. Greg Carey, who was scheduled to preach on Palm Sunday (but car trouble prevented that—he'll be rescheduled for the fall), and the Rev. Dr. Sarah Lund, who will be with us on May 18—the day most of you are reading this.

In October, we had the pet blessing where we blessed 25 dogs and 6 cats. Then WATOTO! African Children's Choir visited us for a concert on November 8. It was an amazing night and a great way to celebrate our decades of support for Innocent. Thank you to Stacie for her continued support and updates from Innocent as well as her general giftedness in all things.

I completed my role as Vice President of the Medina Interfaith Coalition for Affordable Housing (MICAH). We launched a website (<u>micahmedina.org</u>) and connected with area businesses and local government about the need for workforce housing. I'm still on the committee, meeting monthly with other member churches.

In 2024, I officiated 11 funerals and one wedding. I'm thankful for our relationship with Waite Funeral Home. When they have folks who want a religious service without the guilt, they give me a call, and I'm honored to walk these families through a celebration of life.

This past year was also a remarkable one as we participated in *The Promise of Christmas*. We served the Saturday meal to folks who were affected by the hurricane in North Carolina and came up for a "second

Christmas" in January 2025. We were proud partners with Castle Noel, St. Paul's, and other area businesses. Special thanks to our volunteers who cooked soups and hosted for five hours. I especially want to thank Jeff and Melissa Miller, who provided the salads, as well as Cindy Korecky, who organized much of this event. It was amazing! In January and February we took a journey through the Books of Samuel both in worship and in the accompanying bible study for The Prophet and King. Jim Birce printed out large prints and our worship team decorated the church with scrolls and crowns. I really enjoyed that series.

Our music director, Jenny Cochran, resigned in February, and we are discerning who will be our next leader for the choir and bells. I'm so thankful for the interim team of Tracy Gabrielsen, Jerry Mason, and Jen Vilimonovic. The Gathering Band has been excellent as have all of our special music soloists. During my sabbatical, Kate and I encountered Beer and Hymns, a holy moment of worship. I have gathered a small group of strummers and pickers to bring that to our city sometime in fall of 2025. We sure do a good job making a joyful noise!

During Lent we partnered again with St Paul Episcopal and St Matthew Lutheran for AJ Levine's *Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginners Guide to Holy Week*. We did our Wednesday night ecumenical DVD bible studies and AJ even joined us for a Zoom Q&A session!

I'm involved in faith formation at the association level through my work with the SPIRE Center (<u>livingwaterone.org/spirecenter</u>). I'm also planning a clergy retreat for January 2026 with the Rev. Dr. Kelly Brill and the Rev. Brian Shields.

Here's the space where I usually set three goals to work on. Here's what I'm looking at:

- Fall Capital Campaign: We pledged to be on the square for another 200 years. Ten years ago, we built a new addition. Now it's time to refresh the old section with HVAC upgrades, a new roof, and sanctuary renovations. I'll work with both Property & Grounds and Stewardship & Finance to launch this in fall 2025.
- Website Refresh: Having worked on the MICAH website, it's clear that it's time to refresh our own. It's been on my to-do list too long—so I need y'all to hold me accountable.
- Planning the 2025–2026 Worship Year: With Pastor Meghan going on maternity leave sometime
 in late fall, it's important to get our worship series locked in. We also want the DELTS programming
 to align with what the adults are learning upstairs.

We are a vibrant faith community based on welcoming, loving, and serving all God's people. And we're living into that call! We're seeing exciting Sunday worships, lots of visitors, and new members. God is doing something in our midst.

Let's keep at it, church. We got this.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION 2024-25

It has been a great year for the children and youth of Medina UCC.

In the fall Jesus Vibes once again created a video to be shown to the congregation. The youth wrote a script, prepared props and costumes, and performed the skit. The skit, *The Empty Tomb*, was shown the week after Easter. They also made bulletin covers for their skit. A huge thanks to Deanna Ockunzzi (and Sammy and Max) for doing the editing of the video. After much discussion with the DELT'S it was decided that we would take on a more traditional approach to Sunday for the second half of the year as the videos just became too much to manage. Thank you to Katy Medley, Jenny Wolff, Deanna Ockunzzi, and Melissa Bilikam for stepping in and leading the Jesus Vibes class. I met with the middle school youth on Sunday mornings to discuss current events and their faith. Starting in the fall of 2025 I will be having a video club (I have to come up with a fun name) for those youth who would like to continue to produce videos to be used in worship. The plan for now is to meet on Sundays before youth group, but that could change.

Our Jr. Viber's (3 yrs-2nd grade) continue to have fun learning all kinds of stories and lessons, creating crafts and of course there are the snacks! Thank you to Kenzie Armbrust, Quinn Behler, Melissa Miller, and Michelle Colon for loving our littles, teaching them, and making Jr. Vibes fun.

This year we had six lovely young ladies participate and complete the Bible Class. It was a new curriculum this year, and the girls liked it. They received their Bible on April 27th and presented their bible projects during the children's sermon. A special coffee hour was held in their honor.

In June we had 90 children attend Just Like Me, Digging In and Growing Deep Vacation Bible School where we celebrated who we are, learned how to use our voice, and shared our gifts with our community! It was a week of stories, games, snacks, music, crafts, and fun! We concluded the week with a concert in the sanctuary where the kids shared their songs from the week and of course our tradition of ice cream sundaes. The highlight of our last day was a visit from the Ohio Bird Sanctuary. Abby Yates came and did a presentation with several birds of prey, including Blaze, the Peregrine Falcon, who the children adopted by raising money during the week of VBS. It was a fun week!

The children and youth, with help from our church family, are continuing to sponsor Innocent, a young man from Uganda, Africa. We have developed a wonderful relationship with Innocent, and we always look forward to hearing from him.

On December 8th, the children and youth performed the annual Christmas Pageant. "Manger Tales" was the Christmas story told from the viewpoint of the animals. The children did an amazing job, and it was a wonderful gift for our church family.

ANNUAL REPORT OF HOBBY HORSE PRESCHOOL 2024-25

The mission of Hobby Horse Preschool is to provide an age-appropriate, child-centered education in a loving Christian environment. We seek to foster the development of the whole child by facilitating growth—socially, physically, emotionally, spiritually, and intellectually.

Hobby Horse Preschool was purchased by Medina UCCC in 2006, serving a total of 165 children and their families in the 2006-2007 school year. God continues to bless the preschool in 2024-2025 with an enrollment of 127 children and their families. Our service to these children and their families this past school year includes the following highlights.

- Mrs. Jennifer Vilimonovic will complete her 5th year as Director of Hobby Horse Preschool and Mrs. Michele Grubbs will complete her 4th year as Administrative Assistant of Hobby Horse Preschool on June 30, 2025. Mr. Pete Metzloff served as the Finance Director. The teaching staff currently includes Mrs. Vanessa Butsko, Mrs. Krista Carpenter, Mrs. Michele Grubbs, Mrs. Megan Hatala, Mrs. Stephanie Jordan, Mrs. Danielle Kay, Mrs. Yvonne (Bonnie) Kluth, Mrs. Kayla Liebenguth, Mrs. Melissa Miller, Mrs. Adrienne Owens, Mrs. Heather Resan, Mrs. Nicole Schachinger, Mrs. Holly Schwamel, Mrs. Elisha Vitou, and Mrs. Stacie Yates. Our list of substitute teachers includes Mrs. Jodi Robbins, and Mrs. Kelly Monroe (starting April 2025).
- Hobby Horse Preschool started on Thursday, September 5, 2024 with 123 students enrolled. By January 2025, 2 students withdrew and 4 new students were added, ending the year with 127 students. This is slightly lower than last year. This is because we have less spaces available with full-day classes options, and our afternoon 3s and 4s classes are pulling less students. We are not sure why this is happening, but afternoons have never been the same since Covid. We are always looking for ways to remedy the issue.
- The teaching staff continues to work wonderfully together! Individual teacher evaluations will be completed for Mrs. Megan Hatala and Mrs. Danielle Kay as they are completing their first year. Mrs. Kayla Liebenguth and Mrs. Nicole Schachinger will not be joining us for the 2025-2026 school year due to personal circumstances. They will be missed! We will also hold a staff meeting at the end of the year to review the 24-25 school year, and to create our 25-26 school year curriculum and calendar. The preschool's full-day programing is doing very well and we are offering TT, MWF, and TWTF options.
- Hobby Horse Preschool held 2 different charity drives during the holiday season. In November, we collected 227 lbs. of food for Feeding Medina County. In December, we collected gently used electronic/battery operated toys for Replay for Kids.
- Hobby Horse Preschool held its stable themed Nativity Story program in December. We've decided
 to rotate the theme through a 3-theme cycle to keep our repeat audience members entertained.
 The theme for 25-26 will be Polar Express. The children will wear their best Christmas pajamas for
 the performance and we will share chocolate chip cookies and hot chocolate in Fellowship Hall with
 our guests before going home.
- Mr. Jack Stoll continued for the 12th year as Hobby Horse Preschool's Santa Claus. We love Santa Jack!!

- Hobby Horse Preschool was not awarded any grants this year. Mrs. Teri Fodor, a Hobby Horse Team
 member, is helping the preschool look for grant options. Our focus is to find a grant that will allow
 us to repair and update the preschool entrance. The Church did receive Employee Retention Tax
 Credits and the Stewardship Team awarded us a "rent free" 2025. The Preschool Team voted to
 place those funds back into payroll and teacher support. Thank you, Stewardship Team!
- In place of what would have been our 4th Annual Trike-A-Thon, we held a 12 basket raffle to raise funds for the preschool during our 17th Annual Art Show, "A Night at the Auction." Each class offered a themed basket to the raffle with the help of our parents, and the Preschool Team created a "Parents Night Out" basket with the help of local businesses. The event took place April 10-11, 2025 and we raised \$1,874.00. These funds and funds raised from our Stoller Butter Braids fundraiser held November 2024 (\$1,997.70) will go toward purchasing new air conditioning units for the classrooms.
- The Endowment Team awarded the preschool funds to help purchase a double-door swinging gate
 for the East Liberty entrance. This gate was requested by licensing during our annual inspection to
 secure our outdoor play space for the children while outside. The gate will be installed over the
 Summer in preparation for the 2025-2026 school year. Thank you, Endowment Team!
- We did not ask for donations from the Church for our Scholarship Fund this year as we still have a significant amount available due to past donations and fundraising. This year, we helped 8 families with their tuition.
- Once again, we focused on the Nativity story (November/December), the teachings of the Fruits of
 the Spirit (February), and Mrs. Stacie Yates shared the Easter Story with her basket of eggs (April).
 Mrs. Vilimonovic also led a Day of the Dead lesson (October/November) where the children read a
 story, created decorations, gathered photos of deceased loved ones, and then decorated the Chapel
 and Sanctuary for All Saints Day. She would like to visit more Bible stories during her music time
 with the children next school year. Those stories are still under consideration but will most likely be
 the story of Loaves and Fishes (January), the story of Creation (February), and Jesus Walks on Water
 (March).
- Graduation will be held in the Sanctuary on May 15 and 16, 2025. There are 71 children graduating this year!
- Thank you to all who have and continue to support our beloved preschool including Pastor Luke Lindon, Pastor Meghan Malone, Mr. Pete Metzloff, Mrs. Cindy Korecky, Mrs. Cathy Fafrak, Mr. Jack Sharpe, and the Property & Grounds Team.
- Thank you to the Hobby Horse Preschool Team for your ongoing dedication and support. We will say goodbye to Mrs. Kristin Zabrosky on June 30, 2025 as this will be her last year on the team.

In closing, parents and grandparents come from all over mentioning the good things they hear and praising the great work we are doing. Staff morale is wonderful, and our children are excited to be at school. Hobby Horse Preschool is more than a school, it is a family where all are supported and loved.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DISCIPLESHIP AND EDUCATION LEADERSHIP TEAM 2024-2025

The Discipleship and Education Leadership Team (DELT) is responsible for planning and facilitating ministries that nurture the Christian education, faith development, spiritual growth, and biblical understanding of our children, youth, and adults.

Over the past year, the Discipleship and Education Team worked together to sustain a strong Sunday School program, including Jesus Vibes for children in grades 3-7 and Junior Vibes for children age 3-grade 2. The Jesus Vibes group engaged in project-based learning both in the video production room and maker space from August through December. Beginning in January, due to increasing attendance numbers, we opted to divide the Jesus Vibes group into two separate groups: grades 3-5 and grades 6-7. We also decided to shift the 3rd-5th grade group to a more structured Sunday school lesson format, and we introduced a new model for the middle school group, allowing them to connect real-world issues with Christian principles through discussion and activities.

Teens in grades 8-12 met with Pastor Meghan on the last Sunday of each month for Teen Church during the entire 10:30 service to spend quality time together and share snacks and conversation.

The Discipleship and Education Team also coordinated or supported the following programs and events: VBS, Alive on the Square, Youth Group, fall family bonfire, Candlelight Walk bake sale, Advent family fun night, Christmas pageant, youth mission trip fundraisers, board game night, 3rd grade Bible class, and Easter egg hunt.

A sub-committee of DELT has been meeting since October 2024 to assess all current programming for children and youth and to write a proposal for a plan to sustain the strengths and fine-tune areas where growth and improvement can be made. The committee's hope is for a final product that is clear and concise but also comprehensive, so that any future staff and volunteers working with children will be able to step in and get started on Day 1, using the plan as a resource.

Goals for 2025-2026:

- Establish a check-in system for Sunday school attendees to enhance safety
- Develop a year-long calendar available for families at the beginning of the school year to allow for planning and to increase the ease of volunteering
- Increase support for children with additional needs

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PROPERTY & GROUNDS TEAM 2024-25

The Property and Grounds team has worked hard this year to keep roof leaks at bay and our HVAC systems functioning efficiently. Several repairs have been made to the roof above Fellowship Hall, and our air conditioning systems have received several repairs. The steam boiler system has also received many repairs in order to keep the building warm through a very cold winter. We've also completed a full conditions assessment of the church, evaluating the age and condition of the parking lot, grounds, the buildings and the finishes and systems within the buildings. We updated our church rental form to include language recommended by our insurance carrier, and we also updated our fee structure for renting various spaces within the church. Finally, through the generosity of several memorial gifts and a contribution from our Endowment Fund we were able to replace the oven, cooktop, and dishwasher in the church kitchen. We look forward to an upcoming capital campaign to address the aging roof and HVAC systems that have been problematic this year.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE STAFFING TEAM 2024-25

The following are the highlights of the Staffing Team for the year:

Pastor Luke Lindon's sabbatical coverage was provided mostly by our Associate Pastor, Rev. Meghan Malone. A temporary increase in salary was given to Rev. Meghan for these increased duties.

The Staffing Team reorganized and began meeting more frequently to match our responsibilities to the Church Bylaws. This includes looking at our Annual Review Policies, The Church's Constitution, The Bylaws, and Personnel Policies. We anticipate having these documents completed by the winter annual meeting. We are also working on establishing a Sabbatical Policy.

We worked with Pastor Luke to make sure that all of the employees had their Annual Review and that someone from the Staffing Team was present as a neutral party. The Staffing Team also oversaw the Annual Review for Pastor Luke.

The Staffing Team, along with the Finance/Stewardship Team, recommended an increase in salaries for our Staff. The work hours of the Director of Christian Education were reduced to be more in line with the current job.
